Introduction

METREX will hold its Autumn Conference 2018 in Brussels on 11 and 12 October. It coincides with the EU Week of the Regions. The latter will focus on the next round of EU programmes linked to (amongst others) the Cohesion Policies and the European Regional Development Fund.

As METREX is a network for practitioners, in other words, for the people responsible for delivering solutions for the EU programmes and their often abstract aims, this moment in time seems right to show what METREX members are working on: Metropolitan Solutions.

The theme of the conference is:

Metropolitan Solutions - Translating policies into Actions on a Regional Level

The conference programme will see three main parts:

- Setting the scene, about the context in which our members are working on the various EU projects and programmes. In what frame is the project done, who are the partners in the project (inside and/or outside the region), how is the level of support from and feedback to the responsible EU counterpart, etc.
- Presentations of Metropolitan Solutions, showing examples of all kinds from METREX members and beyond. Metropolitan Regions show their projects, where they stand now and/or results achieved, and we will see projects from organisations that involve (regional) authorities.
- Reflecting on on what is heard, sharing the experiences and how the network can support its members. This reflection is part of the Friday programme when we look forward into the next five years of METREX.

Metropolitan Solutions are presented by METREX members as well as partnered organisations like Eurocities, Urban M and other Metropolitan Regions and Cities. The presentations will be in small groups that will offer the opportunity to discuss, ask questions and draw principles that can be taken home.

PARALLEL SESSIONS 1ST ROUND

1. A smarter Europe by promoting innovative and smart economic transformation

- Città Metropolitana di Milano: New Skills and new jobs in the future metropolitan cities.
- Brno MA: Metropolitan Cooperation Development Brno Metropolitan Area (BMA) through ITI instrument.

2. A greener, low-carbon Europe by promoting clean and fair energy transition, green and blue investment, the circular economy, climate adaptation and risk prevention and management

- Amsterdam: A Dutch approach for bottom-up energy strategies at the regional level. It fits into the frame of addressing the binding targets of CO2 reduction and collaboration for decarbonising strategies at the metropolitan level. MRA is preparing a regional energy strategy at the metropolitan level.

3. A more connected Europe by enhancing mobility and regional ICT connectivity

- Vienna: Within the frame of Interreg III, the Centrope is a trans-national programme in which INAT is part: Infrastructure Needs Assessment Tools.
- Helsinki: How do future developments, like the Helsinki's Airport Rail corridor and the Helsinki Tallin Tunnel project, fit into the long-term goals of TEN-T's cohesion policies?
In turn, it is anticipated that these mega-projects offer significant agglomeration benefits and development potential, not only to Finland and the Helsinki city-region, but to the wider macro-region of the Baltic Space, including the capital regions along Rail Baltica. It will be highlighted that the future city-region local public rail transport infrastructure investment will be equally significant in a multi-billion euro programme to upgrade the city-region's radial and transversal rail network. Together, Helsinki's new regional and transnational mobility measures represent an important sustainable contribution to the EU and supports its spatial cohesion policy to create a future of polycentric city-regions across Europe.

4. A more social Europe implementing the European Pillar of Social Rights

5. A Europe closer to citizens by fostering the sustainable and integrated development of urban, rural and coastal areas and local initiatives

- Region Verband Stuttgart: Regional Landscape parks: The region funds projects within the master plans developed by the municipalities. Region Verband Stuttgart is in the EU Urban Agenda partnership on sustainable land-use and nature-based solutions.
